#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:



Welcome to the 2022-2023 school year! My name is Sarah MacKay and I am your ETFO Hastings-Prince Edward Teacher Local President. I look forward to my second term and third year as your president.

The ETFO Hastings-Prince Edward Elementary Teacher Local represents

close to 700 contract teachers at 40 different worksites throughout Hastings County and Prince Edward County and we are here for all of you. I am proud to be a teacher and proud to be your President. Your union is your safety net, and we are here when you need us.

#### **Central Collective Bargaining**

Our Collective Agreement ended on August 31, 2022. ETFO has begun the process of central bargaining with the Ontario Public School Boards' Association (OPSBA) and the Crown. The last meeting was held on September 23, 2022 to establish a central bargaining list. There was a dispute over whether or not hiring would be a central bargaining item (ETFO) or a local bargaining item (OPSBA, the Crown). Central bargaining has now paused as ETFO has referred the dispute to the Ontario Labour Relations Board (OLRB) for a ruling. Visit etfocb.ca for information on Central Bargaining. #### **Local Collective Bargaining**

Last year, our local Collective Bargaining Committee met to review the preliminary submissions made by the Board and by the Local in the last round of bargaining. The committee then sent out a survey to the membership for feedback on what members saw as priorities for our Local. This information is being used as we begin the process of writing our preliminary submission for this round of bargaining while still awaiting to learn the central table items

#### September Enrolment Imbalances

The Joint Staffing Committee met and made recommendations for school reorganizations. Decision-making is guided by several provisions in the Collective Agreement (school staffing averages and Grade 4-8 system-wide averages), and well as Ministry Regulations (a Kindergarten at cap, primary class size caps of 20, etc.), and some flexibility for school-based decisions which can be achieved within the CA and Ministry requirements. Enrolment increased this year as almost all students made their way back to in-school learning. Only the Virtual School saw a decrease in staffing while addition staffing was needed in 9 of our schools. This was good news as it allowed to us to recall all of the teachers who were still Surplus to the System at the beginning of the year. At the time of writing, the JSC has gone through the surplus process, the Recall process, the two rounds of mid-year transfers due to the September Enrolment Imbalances, and the increase of part time staff to full time. The Board is now in the process of hiring for the remaining unfilled positions. Unfortunately, as many of us know, this process does take time. We hope to have all staff in place as soon as feasibly possible.

## Is water damage covered by car insurance?




