PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:



It is hard to believe that September is gone and that the Thanksgiving weekend is upon us. I'm sure you are all thankful for the break, I know I am. I am very thankful for the work done in our Local by our members, stewards, committee's and executive members. The strength of our Local does come from all of us working

together. I am also thankful that this year there will be no talk of strike action or negotiations. Although we have a Collective Agreement in place until 2026 though, working on Collective Agreement compliance and improvements continues. To this end, I hope that you will be able to attend the ETFO Engagement Meeting at The Grand on October 28th at 5:30. ETFO Vice-President Shirley Bell will be joining us and wants to hear from you, the grass roots members, about your experiences in your classrooms and the changes you want to see. September Enrolment Imbalances

The Joint Staffing Committee has met and made recommendations for school reorganizations. As always, decision-making is guided by several provisions in the Collective Agreement (school staffing averages and Grade 4-8 system-wide averages), and well as Ministry Regulations (a Kindergarten cap, primary class size caps, etc.), with some flexibility for school-based decisions which can be achieved within the CA and Ministry requirements. Enrolment increased by 20 students this year; however, this did not have a great impact on staffing. There were two schools that decreased in staff and only one that increased by a full FTE. Currently there is only one partial position left unfilled and all other moves/reorganizations will have been completed by October 9th.

Joint Staffing Committee Timetable Survey

Each fall, timetables are collected by the Joint Staffing Committee for review. Although this is often referred to as the "ETFO timetables", it is for the entire Joint Staffing Committee and not just ETFO. Article L11.02 School Timetables/Plans in our Collective Agreement states "The Joint Staffing Committee will review school timetables and school plans annually to ensure compliance with the Collective Agreement based on mutually agreed upon timelines (see L17.04.01)." Article L7.04.01 states that "Each Teacher will submit to the School Staffing Committee a copy of their individual

timetable no later than the final school day in September. The Teacher will include a written analysis of total 5 day instructional time which will not exceed the limits of the Collective Agreement. The Teacher will also include an analysis of preparation time which will be no less than the minimums described in the Collective Agreement, and supervision time which will be no greater than the maximum described in the Collective Agreement. The Joint Staffing Committee will determine the method of reporting this information. The principal and the School Steward will ensure this information is collected and forwarded to the Joint Staffing Committee for analysis. Copies of all materials forwarded to the Joint Staffing Committee shall be maintained in the School Staffing Committee's records by the school steward." Although timetables are to be collected by the final school day in September, the Joint Staffing Committee did mutually extend this timeline due to the recent school reorganizations. We appreciate your efforts to fill out the Timetable Survey and submit your timetables!

Safe Schools Incident Reporting:

Far too often we are made aware of concerning student behaviours within your classrooms and schools. It is important, and mandatory, that Safe Schools Student Incident Report are completed. If you have observed or become aware of a student "behaving in a way that is likely to have a negative impact on the school climate", a response is required of you. The behaviour should be reported to the principal as soon as possible. You are asked to complete the Safe Schools Student Incident Reporting Form – Part 1 on every occasion when a report is made to the principal regarding student misconduct which can lead to a suspension or expulsion. Wherever possible, it is expected that the teacher will provide an oral report to the principal at the earliest, safe opportunity. The written report (Form 378-15) must be completed and submitted online to the principal/viceprincipal or teacher-in-charge when it is safe to do so and no later than the end of the school day. Once you have completed the Safe Schools Incident Report on Clevr, send an email to your principal letting them know you have submitted a form.

Form 378-15 provides a list of activities for which suspension/ expulsion must be considered. If you are being told not to complete the Safe Schools Incident Form or have any questions regarding the Safe School Incident Forms, please reach out to 1st Vice-President, Jason Surgent at <code>jsurgent@etfohp.on.ca</code>.







What is your QECO rating?

From time to time the Local requests information from the board regarding our member's QECO category ratings. We do this to better support our members in moving up the pay grid, if they choose to do so. We know there are several members at both A2 and A3. Moving up the qualifications grid will significantly increase a member's income. Our local has negotiated funds, specifically the Additional Qualifications, AQ Fund, in our collective agreement to directly support members financially if they wish to take courses required to change categories. For the current school year, there are a limited number of applications remaining for spring courses. Courses taken after June 1, 2024 would be eligible for the 2024-25 school year AQ Fund for most members. New members are eligible to access funds based on their start date this school year.

If you go to the QECO site, geco.on.ca, you will find an extensive list of requirements needed for moving up a pay category. In most cases, it is a matter of completing a three part specialist or taking one or two AQ courses. Most of these courses can also be tax deductible, however you should consult a tax professional for further information. Additional Qualifications courses are offered by many universities and EFTO also offers these courses. The ETFO offerings can be found at https://etfo-aq.ca/catalogue/#dates.

If you have taken an Additional Qualifications course recently, make sure that you inform QECO and the board. The information is not sent automatically to the board. It is your responsibility to make sure that you are being paid at the appropriate rate.

If you are not currently A4, we would strongly encourage you to pursue changing your QECO rating. We would be very happy to assist you if you have questions regarding your QECO rating. You can also contact QECO directly through their website qeco.on.ca or call 1 (800) 385-1030.
